Friends in Christ,

As you are reading these words we will be starting the month of March, and I think many are hoping that March will bring an early spring ②. While we can hope, no one knows for sure what kind of weather March will bring, but one thing that March does certainly bring us is the season of Lent. From the conversations that I have had about Lent, it seems that many believe that Lent is just a somber season where we give something up that we enjoy making ourselves miserable for forty days. I know I heard things like that about Lent when I was growing up. However, in recent years I've learned that Lent is actually a beautiful season in the church year. During Lent

God offers us some great opportunities as a church and as Christians and I'd like to use the space in this newsletter page to explore some of the opportunities that we have during Lent.

Lent is a season that emphasizes many things. Two of them that I will be focusing on in this article are prayer and getting away from self-indulgence. Most Christians chose to give up something that they enjoy during Lent in order to turn away from our self-indulgence. However, I've discovered that taking up a faith practice during Lent is often more helpful for moving us beyond selfishness. For example, rather than giving up watching tv or eating sweets during Lent, you could instead set aside some extra time for doing things like reading scripture or praying every day. You could also try giving just a little bit more of your time, talents, and possessions to helping God's work. You could even practice spending extra time with family and friends during Lent.

Lent is also a season that emphasizes prayer. Prayer is important because it helps us get past our own opinions and desires by helping us to see how God is challenging us to be more faithful. As a congregation we must always be discerning God's will and what God is calling us to do as God's people in the church. We must also always be discerning how God is calling us to care for the needs of the world. We must also always be discerning us to grow as a congregation and at the same time to remain faithful to the gospel of Jesus Christ. Finally, we must also always be discerning how God is calling us to see discerning how God is calling us to reach out and share the love of Christ. Prayer is a key component in helping us discern all of these things.

Prayer is also important for our lives. Prayer provides us with assurance of the mercy, forgiveness, love, and grace that God always freely gives to us in Jesus Christ. Prayer reminds us of all the promises that we have in Jesus Christ and that we have been claimed as God's children no matter what. Prayer also helps us to discern where we need healing in our lives and how we're called to reach out to others. Lent presents us with an opportunity to dive deeper into the world of prayer so we can continue to discover who God is calling us to be as disciples and together as the church.

I hope this shows you how Lent offers us some great opportunities as disciples. Through emphasis on prayer and getting past self-indulgence, Lent offers us some great ways that we can feed our faith and grow more deeply into God's people. God is always reaching out to us with love and grace, and this Lenten season we can dive into that love and grace together.




