Friends in Christ,

I can hardly believe that the summer's almost over and that fall will soon be here. There's a lot happening in the congregation this fall; rally Sunday is September 7 where we'll have our outdoor service, council installation, and family fun day. Our bible study on *The Chosen* will be resuming as well. Finally, our Sunday School and Confirmation classes will be restarting for the programmatic year. I feel blessed because we've had some wonderful Confirmation classes here that I've enjoyed teaching. One of my favorite lessons for Confirmation class is about Martin Luther's explanation of the eighth commandment "you are not to bear false witness against your neighbor." In the *Small Catechism* Luther explains that this means that

we should "not tell lies about our neighbors, betray or slander them, or destroy their reputations." That seems logical and I think many Christians would offer a similar explanation of what the eighth commandment means. However, Luther's explanation of the eighth commandment expands to explain that we should also "come to our neighbor's defense, speak well of them, and interpret everything they do in the best possible light." Wow, that is quite the commandment!

However, in this deeply divided and broken world, we seem to be surrounded by examples of people failing to follow this command faithfully. When I do this lesson in Confirmation, I have the students share examples of how humanity fails to follow this command faithfully, some of the examples they've given have included gossiping about or slandering others behind their back, talking negatively about others on social media, radio, or television, and stereotyping people. The result of all of this has created a lot of hurt, hatred, division, and conflict throughout creation. Admittedly it is not easy to always "come to our neighbor's defense, speak well of them, and interpret everything they do in the best possible light". I too struggle to always live this out. However, it is vital that we do this because whether we realize it or not, we are all God's people. Genesis 1:27 declares that all human beings are created in the image of God, so every human being is sacred and deserves to be treated with dignity. Just consider how much better the world would be if everyone followed this commandment faithfully; people from different political ideologies would get along and even work together for the common good. People from different cultures and social classes would treat one another as friends growing as individuals through sharing their different experiences with one another. Gossip and bullying could be replaced by friendships.

Now do not mishear this as advocating for some kind of blank uniformity. Because the fact is that we can follow the eighth commandment and at the same time disagree or even debate with one another. Further, we can also publicly express our opinions when we believe others are wrong or mistaken about something. None of these things are necessarily mutually exclusive to following the eighth commandment! However, when we do these things, we're called to be respectful, so as not to slander our neighbors and ensure that we are portraying them in a positive manner as God instructs for us to do. Following the eighth commandment faithfully certainly breaks from social norms and isn't easy, but contrary to what you might hear or believe it is possible. I have witnessed people disagree with one another in a way that is both respectful and civil. I have also seen people come to their neighbor's defense when they witness them being gossiped about or other forms of slander against them. Finally, I have seen people overcoming the ubiquitous divisiveness that surrounds us by speaking about others positively and praying for others. I pray that God might help us all follow the eighth commandment faithfully together for the sake of the world.

REVIEW & APPROVAL OF FINANCIALS:

Financials and Pastor's report were reviewed. Motion made by Linda to approve, seconded by Kreg, and carried. **June Notes/Council Minutes:** Accepted. Motion made by Kreg to approve, seconded by Amy, and carried.

OLD & NEW BUSINESS:

Tax Parcels – guest speakers Lane Taylor and Dan Hensel presented information from the Dane County Zoning committee. We currently have 7 parcels that make up the Upper church, the Lower church, the cemetery, and the parsonage. Dane County would like us to downsize, if it works for us. Lane and Dan presented the option to go down to 3 parcels: one for both churches, one for the cemetery, and one for the parsonage. We were insured there would be no cost to the church for making such changes. Kreg made a motion to move from 7 zoning parcels down to 3 zoning parcels, seconded by Amy, and carried.

AED (Automated External Defibrillator): It has arrived and has been installed! Both churches now have AEDs units installed. The new unit ended up being donated by an anonymous doner, so there was no cost to the church for this life saving unit. **THANK YOU!!!**

EXTERIOR PROJECTS:

- Sidewalks/concrete: Starting cement work once Diggers Hotline shows up on Thursday. Plan on putting river rock down (like what was done at the Upper Church). Will also be fixing the drains on the south side of the church, as they need to go away from the building.
- ◆ Will be removing and replacing rotted light poles 3 total.
- Education roof there was 1.5 feet of standing water until the drain was unclogged. Need to get a proper roof on there sooner than later.
- Waiting on the electricians to put lights and fans together. Once done, Bryar will raise them back up.
- Windows: emailed Bernie several times, and they are now scheduled to perform the work on Wednesday, August 20th.

Office Manager update: We had a promising candidate interview for the position but ended up retracting their application due to moving out of the area. The Personnel committee is considering posting the position on the Cambridge community Facebook page.

Insurance: We received our policy from Brotherhood Mutual / Lightwell Insurance, which includes our Workman's Compensation Insurance. On another note, State Farm wants to do a Workman's Compensation Insurance audit with us. Linda Hanson is working with State Farm on this request.

Koshkonong Prairie History Society Norwegian Days: Bonnie and Marilyn have taken this over. The event is scheduled for October 12, 2025, at noon at St Paul's Liberty Lutheran Church in Deerfield.

Parsonage: No pressing needs currently, but several MAJOR expenses are on the horizon: the roof is 25 years old, the furnace is 23 years old, and the water heater is 13 years old. This congregation will need to decide if we want to continue parsonage upkeep or make the decision to sell the property and not be landlords.

Roof/Shingles: Missing shingles will be replaced when the lift can be used for other things besides just shingles. Hansons are donating the use of one of their lifts.

New Church Road signs: The family of Harriet Eikland would like to use memorial monies to purchase new road signs for both Hwy 73 and Hillside Road. No updates currently.

Upper Church worship: There have been requests to hold worship services in the Upper Church once a month during the summer months. Next worship will take place on Sunday, August 17th.

Next Meeting: Tuesday, August 19, 2025, at 6pm.

Motion to adjourn at 7:20pm made by Linda, seconded by Amy, and carried.


