Dear Friends,

I am writing this during the annual winter season of excitement in the world of sports - bowl games, play-offs, and exhaustive schedules at all levels for basketball, hockey, wrestling, and other athletic activities. As player, coach, and spectator, I have been a life-long participant in that world. But I do admit that I have been wondering more and more lately if things have gotten out of balance. Let me share with you some reflections on this matter. I have on

file a photo of some frenzied adults urging their babies to cross the finish line first in a crawling contest. Why enter someone who is not yet even a toddler in such a con-

test or in any other? I have attended ball games where at half-time thousands of adults watch a few young children compete in dunking a miniature basketball or dancing to music or running a race. They can be cute, but why at the end are they often judged by audience applause so that a winner can be rewarded while the others walk away as losers? I have seen adult athletes thumping their chests in pride after a great play and have heard some of them declare that God was on their

These are but a few examples of the "culture of winning" that confronts us as individuals, families, and congregations. Sports activities can be fun and healthful, but they can also become the primary means by which children and adults seek acceptance, affirmation, and a sense of self-worth. Thereby, things in individual, family, and church life can become unbalanced. How can church and family compete with the excitement of sports?

Perhaps it is not so much a matter of competing as it is a matter of affirming. We need to affirm that God has created our bodies for vigorous activity, not only in athletic competition but especially for the work of his body, the church of our Lord Jesus Christ. That means getting a whole lot of exercise in such activities as worshiping, praying, teaching, learning, serving others, and doing our part in supporting the congregation of which we are a part. In this way our sense of self-worth will continue to be shaped.

Such affirmation requires that we also frequently encourage one another in the life of faith and remind one another to keep things in proper perspective.

Well, I need to finish this before the next kickoff. . . .But I promise also to take time to work on my next sermon!

I have heard this in the voice of a friend who sees part of his ministry and call in the world to encourage others via facebook posts and communications. I have felt this in the love and courage of my mother... as she continues to parent adult children well while at the same time discerning her next career calling after losing her job last year.

I have heard this as I have listened to people describe their joy and gifts in creating firework displays, bulletin boards, meeting minutes, cabinets, or quilt tops.

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

*God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea; though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult. Psalm 46:1-3*

One year ago yesterday, a catastrophic earthquake struck the nation of Haiti, killing nearly 250,000 people and leaving more than one million homeless. Many of us remember hearing the news and seeing images of the devastation for the first time. We lifted up the people of Haiti in our prayers. We gave generously.

More than 40,000 ELCA members and leaders like you contributed \$12.6 million to support the work of ELCA Disaster Response in Haiti. Because of our long-standing relationships with the Lutheran Church in Haiti and many partners there, the ELCA was and continues to be uniquely positioned to respond quickly and effectively.

Your gifts have:

- Provided **food and shelter** to approximately **57,700** people living in camps coordinated by The Lutheran World Federation and more than **6,000** people who gathered on the grounds of the Lutheran Church in Haiti.

- Shipped **four convoys** of **medical supplies, hygiene and baby kits, tents, food packages** and other necessities.

Funded **housing placement** and **crisis counseling** to Haitian refugees and medical evacuees seeking asylum in Florida and Georgia.

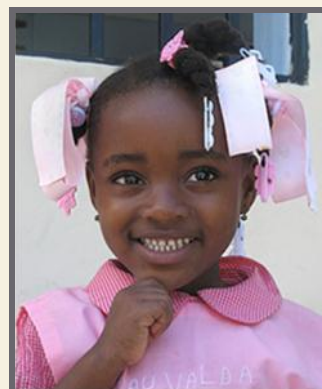
