

Pastor's Message Interim Pastor Jim Schwarz

We have just celebrated another festive Easter Sunday and are living in the glory of the message of resurrection, hope, and life. "Looking forward" (a phrase that we meet frequently these days in contemporary talk), we anticipate a continual celebration in the church of the Good News proclaimed just recently among us and throughout the world.

It is commonplace in the church to say that each Sunday is a "little Easter."

But this statement is not a mere cliché, a trite and worn out expression lacking any depth in meaning. It is filled with possibilities. Consider the following.

What if Christians would gather for worship regularly on the first day of the week?

Even though the New Testament nowhere contains an explicit commandment to worship on the first day, and, in fact seeks to get away from a legalistic approach to this matter, worship on the first day as the Lord's Day seems to have been presupposed and in place within the first generation of the early church.

What if every Sunday the proclamation of God's mighty acts would occur? The Old Testament Sabbath commemorated Creation and the Exodus as crucial events in the history of salvation. At the center of the Christian Sunday is the mightiest act of all in history, God's deliverance of Christ from the grips of death. The message of the Gospel is that by grace through faith the Christian shares in the resurrection victory.

What if Sunday worship would lead to a closer sense of community in daily life among church members and toward the world? Obedience to the Sabbath Commandment was a large part of life for the people of Israel. Their worship permeated all areas of activity under the Old Covenant. In worship, people of the New Covenant continually review all that God has done for them and the world in Christ. Surely, in thanksgiving and with great joy they will go out from each worship service to work with and serve others.

What if Sunday worship would be welcomed as a tithe on time? The Sabbath Commandment insured a "tithe on time," a day of rest devoted to the Lord. Biblical scholar Gerhard von Rad has written that "the Sabbath could be described as the normal day. It is a day which man does not fill to the full with his own ordinary employments, but which he gives back to God clean and unused. Thereby he returns to a truer order, the order which God appointed for the world at the time of the creation."

What if we would consider each Sunday to be a "little Easter" on which we accept the resurrected Lord's gentle invitation: "Come to me, all you that are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. . . Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me"? The possibilities are endless!

Grace and peace to you my sisters and brothers in Christ! I am thankful for you and for the story that we have together to tell that Jesus Christ is Risen! He is Risen indeed!

As an intern, I am in the midst of the candidacy process this year. I completed my Approval Essay at the beginning of April, and I will have my Approval Interview with Luther Seminary faculty next week. It is a time of diving deeper into theology and the amazing gifts of the Sacraments; but it is also a time of looking back and reflecting on the journey of faith, questions, families, mentors, pains, teachers, and learning that has brought me to this place. I am thankful for all of the Sunday School teachers, youth leaders, pastors, mentors, and family members who have faithfully shared the stories of our faith, who have patiently journeyed with me, and who have shared their own testimonies alongside the testimonies of the Bible. How about you, who are those who have come alongside you in your journey?

As you participate in worship you tell the stories of faith to one another, to those older than you and to those younger. As you sing hymns and liturgy, you teach one another, preach to one another, and worship alongside one another. You proclaim that Christ has risen! You proclaim the forgiveness and freedom that God offers. You call out together in prayer. Many of you also invest in the lives of kids, youth, and adults.... as Sunday School teachers, Bible Study leaders, Befrienders, teachers, coaches, and youth volunteers. You share the life-saving message of the Bible and you share the love of Christ through your presence with others.

The book of 1 Thessalonians speaks of the gospel coming with the Holy Spirit and with deep conviction, of the church's welcoming of the message with the joy given by the Holy Spirit, and of the message ringing out from the people. "The Lord's message *rang out* from you..." (1:8) As you journey together, *may the message ring out from you!* May the message ring out from you as you worship, as you walk, as you work. May it ring out as you invest in youth, in neighbors, and in family members. May it ring out as you share the many gifts that the Lord has given you.

Preparation & Instruction for Holy Communion

The following is based upon a document from the ELCA entitled *The Use of the Means of Grace*. **I especially encourage parents who are interested in communion for their children at EKLC to read and respond.**

There is no command from our Lord regarding the age at which people should be first communed. As a result, the age at which baptized members of our congregations receive their first communion reflects a variety of practices.

Some congregations follow a pattern familiar to older generations of Lutherans: first communion is received at the time of confirmation. A generation ago, many of our congregations began preparing catechetical material for children to receive their first communion when they reached fifth grade. Today there is growing awareness that focus on one particular age group may not be the primary factor to determine when first communion is received.

Although no particular age is prescribed by the ELCA, this guideline is offered. Because admission to the sacrament is by invitation of the Lord to the baptized, baptized children begin to commune at a time determined through mutual conversation that includes the pastor, the child, and parents involved, within the accepted practices of the congregation. Each congregation is encouraged to ask the question of readiness for first communion, establish their own policies regarding age and practice, and accompany that practice with instruction appropriate to the age of the communicant.

When congregations receive children as members from another congregation where those children have been accepted as communing members, they should welcome and receive such children as communing members. This may result in diversity of ages regularly receiving the sacrament within a congregation.

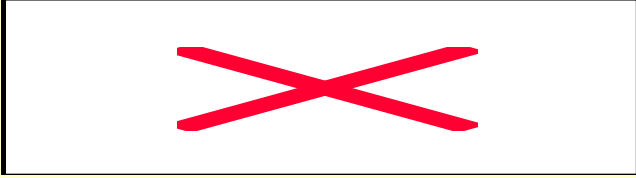
For a number of years East Koshkonong has been following this guideline. Sessions for preparation have been offered each year for parents and their children. **I extend to parents the invitation to contact me to arrange such instruction yet this spring for children 3 years of age or older.** It would be helpful to have enrollment ahead of time so that mutually agreeable dates can be set. Materials and presentations appropriate for the child's age could then be prepared. **Children already communing** are also invited to come and learn more about this gift of Christ to the church.
